Jacksonville, TX. - Baptist Missionary Association Theological Seminary and Texas Education Baptist Congress /Convention launched a history-making alliance June 1, 2007 to impact both local and regional churches and entire communities. "This occasion, without a doubt, is an historic collaboration between Baptist Missionary Association Seminary and the Texas Educational Baptist Congress/convention," said Dr. Jerome Milton, TEBCC President. "our goal is to support those African American students who are studying to become the best prepared under shepherds in tomorrow's churches. We are grateful for the opportunity to work together in making not only an impact, but also an influence in growing God's Kingdom here in East Texas." Through a special partnership, BMATS and the Texas Educational Baptist Congress/Convention will offer two groundbreaking initiatives: Scholarships to local African American pastors through the Harris-Curry Scholarship Program. The scholarship is named for two African American graduates of BMATS - J. T. Harris

is the first African American to graduate from the institution and to distinguish himself as a minister in the greater East Texas area. Dr. S. L. Curry, Pastor of New Zion Baptist Church, Winona, the first African American graduate to earn a doctorate degree (Southwestern Theological Seminary), is president of the Original East Texas Baptist District Association. Dr. Curry is also the first African American professor to be employed by BMATS.

Secondly, these organizations will partner to host the Harris-Curry Pastors and Ministers Unity Conference scheduled for the fall of 2008. The conference open to all area ministers, will offer tools to promote spiritual growth and development in churches. Top church leaders and educators will host seminars on multicultural church awareness, preparation for ministry and community unity. The purpose of this partnership is to train ministers and to provide a quality, solid and accredited seminary education that will impact, not
